- Individual engagement that generated more than 8.8 million ACHE webpage views and almost 15,000 visits to our Premier Corporate Partners webpages.

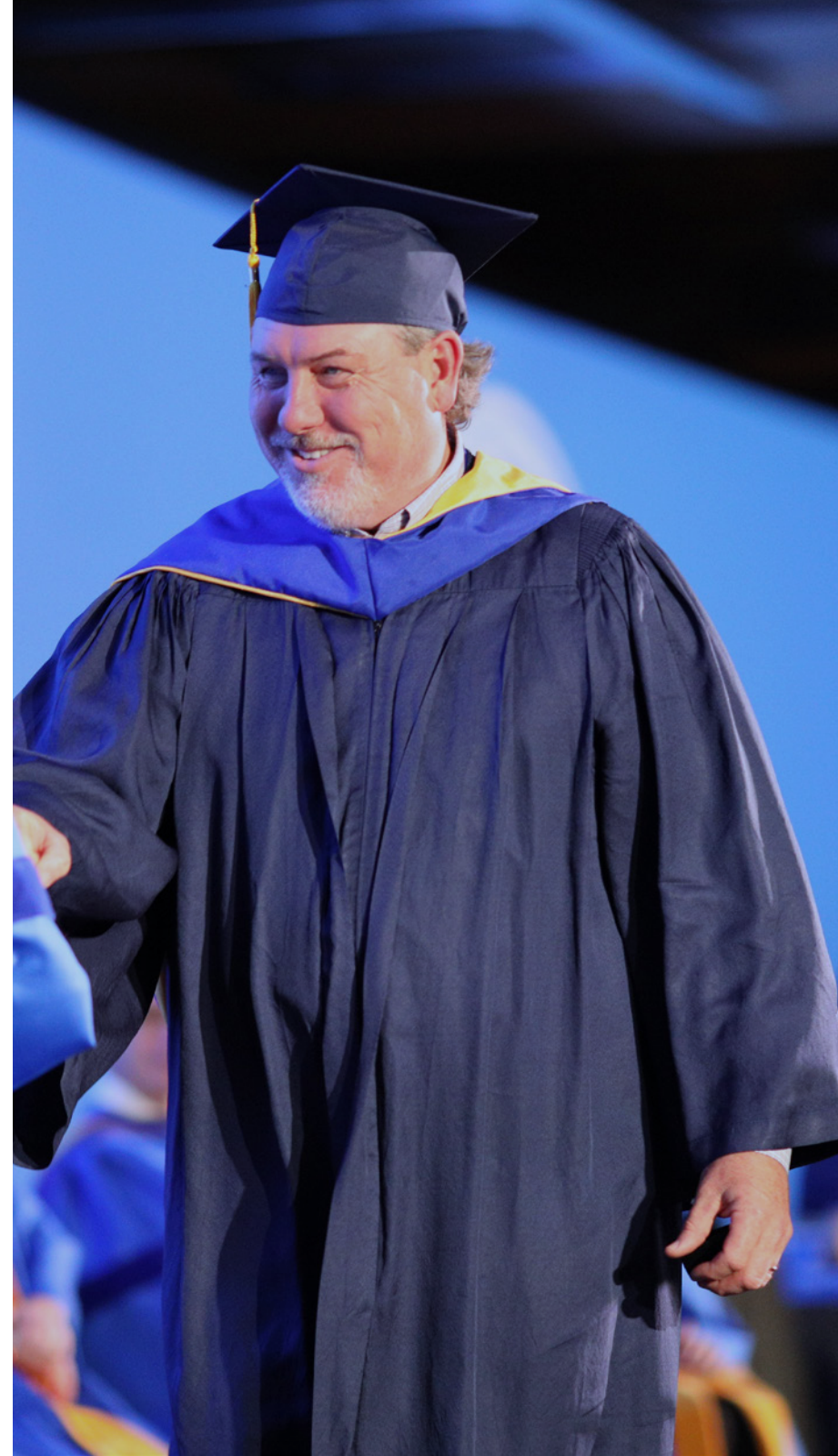


We are a community of collaborators. . .
